History and Mission

The Partnership for Academic Competition Excellence was first organized in 1996 by Samer Ismail (then, an undergraduate at Yale), Emil Thomas Chuck (a graduate student at Case Western Reserve University), and Jonathan Lazar (an undergraduate at University of Maryland Baltimore County) as a volunteer non-profit organization dedicated to raising the profile and quality of high school academic competition throughout the country. Our dream was to organize a high-quality national championship tournament that featured and encouraged the best high school academic competition players and teams. To this end, PACE was established with the following mission statement:

The Partnership for Academic Competition Excellence (PACE) is a non-profit alliance of college and high school academic teams that specifically organize high school academic tournaments across the country.

PACE has many objectives:

- to *promote and encourage* the growth of quality high school invitational tournaments around the country,
- to *provide guidance or assistance* to other colleges or high schools that wish to organize such tournaments,
- to *encourage innovation and creativity* in academic competition,
- to *establish visibility* for college academic team programs that run high school tournaments,
- to *foster cooperation* among college and high school programs in preparation for upcoming regional, state, or national tournaments,
- to *encourage participation* of teams in tournaments across the country prior to regional, state, or national tournaments,
- to *allow* all teams adequate opportunity to practice, compete, and socialize among other fellow competitors.

There is no membership fee to be part of this network. However, the success of this project depends on the willingness and dedication of high school and college academic competition organizations to share information and volunteer their time and effort.

2007 PACE NSC Rules

GAME FORMAT & RULES SUMMARY

The PACE NSC format consists of three phases in each match.

In the first phase, the related tossup/bonus phase, there are ten tossups. Each tossup is associated with a two-part, 20-point bonus that is in the same subject area as the tossup.

In the second phase, the category quiz, there are eight tossups. After correctly answering a tossup, the team picks the bonus category from a standard list. The bonus here is one-part and worth 15 points.

In the third phase, the stretch phase, there are ten tossups. A correct tossup earns a three-part, 30-point bonus that will not be related to the tossup. In this phase, if a player buzzes before *or during* the reading of the phrase “for 10 points” with a correct tossup answer; then the correct answer is worth 20 points instead of 10. Whether the first syllable of the next word after “for 10 points” has been read is a moderator judgment call and is not protestable.

If the game is tied after the stretch phase, then there are an additional three tossups with unrelated thirty-point bonuses read. There are no powers on the tossups. Bonus parts bounce back as normal.

If the game is still tied following the extra three tossups and associated bonuses, then tiebreaker tossups are read until one team wins the game by answering a tossup correctly. A wrong answer does not automatically lose the game—the other team must answer the question correctly to win.

TOSSUPS

Correct tossup answers are worth 10 points at all times in the related tossup/bonus phase and category quiz, and once the first syllable of the next word after “for 10 points” has been read in the stretch phase.

Incorrect tossup answers at any point *do not* lose points for a team (i.e., there are no “negs”); however, they do lock out all other members of that team from buzzing on that question and entitle the opponent to hear the remainder of the tossup, if any.

On tossups, there is no substantive conferring allowed. This includes talking, writing, or hand signaling *that is designed to communicate information about what the answer might be*. Conferring will be treated exactly the same as a wrong answer. Waving off teammates from buzzing, verbal interjections of surprise, and other *non-substantive* communication is permitted. Answering when you have not buzzed in will be treated as conferring and thus a wrong answer, but will not result in the tossup being thrown out—the other team will be allowed to hear the remainder of the question and answer as normal. Thus, moderators will not rule on the correctness of inappropriately blurted answers, but merely call conferring and complete the question.

BONUSES

There are bouncebacks on all bonus parts. This means that if the team which correctly answered the tossup does not get a bonus part right, the other team has an immediate

chance to answer that part for the full point value. The next part of the bonus (if any) will then be read to the team which answered the tossup, and the procedure repeated.

Bonus answers which are clearly directed at the moderator will be accepted from any player, so there is no need for captains to defer. The moderator will ask the captain for an answer if there is no answer being given or conflicting answers coming from different players.

TIMING

Time limits are as follows: 5 seconds after a tossup is completed to buzz in, 5 seconds after buzzing in to begin answering, 5 seconds after the completion of a bonus part to begin answering, and 2 seconds after the opposing team's bonus answer is ruled wrong to give a bounceback answer. The time limit for the calculation bonus in the category quiz is 20 seconds. If a team gives an incorrect answer to the calculation bonus, the opposing team is entitled to the remainder of the 20 seconds before giving its answer. On all other bonus parts, the bounceback time limit is 2 seconds regardless of how quickly the first team gave its answer. Teams will be prompted for an answer one second before time expires on bonuses. There is no such prompting on tossups. Timing calls are not protestable.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Player substitutions are allowed before the category quiz, before the stretch phase, and before the tiebreaker if there is one. There are no substitutions allowed during any other pauses in gameplay. If a tiebreaker goes to sudden death, that is not an additional substitution opportunity. Players are free to re-enter the game at a future substitution opportunity after they are subbed out.

PROTESTS

Protests may be lodged after any completed question. Possible grounds for a protest include: the answer on the paper is wrong, more of the answer than necessary was required, an appropriate prompt was not listed or given, the clues in the question contradicted each other, or a rule was applied improperly. **Judgment calls, including the calling of time, what pronunciation of an answer the moderator heard, or whether an answer on a bonus part was directed at the moderator, are not protestable.** At the end of the game, if the protest could affect the outcome, then the TD will rule on it and, if necessary, replay affected questions. Thus, teams should stay in their room if there is a live protest. We ask that teams lodging protests simply say "protest" and have it marked on the sheet, then move on to the next question. Bickering with the moderator or the other team about a protest only wastes time. Protests which do not affect the outcome of the game but can be ruled upon without reseating the teams will also be ruled upon. In practice, this is limited to the possibility of getting retroactive credit for a bonus answer added to your total points in a game that was not determined by that question.

If you have any further questions about the rules, then please ask the TD during the opening meeting.

Benjamin Cooper Academic Ambassador Award

A cherished NSC tradition is the reading of the 1998 citation of the Benjamin Cooper Academic Ambassador award prior to the presentation of this year's recipients. Here is the text.

Whereas many teams are well recognized by the strength of their winning programs, sportsmanship and service to the academic competition community are not well appreciated. These virtues not only make academic competitions possible, exciting, and enjoyable, but also are fundamentally necessary for the further growth and promotion of this game at all levels of play. By recognizing individuals or organizations that by their example embody the positive aspects of academic competition, all participants involved in quiz bowl honor the competitive spirit and camaraderie that quiz bowl competitions provide.

To encourage the appreciation of these individuals and organizations, be it resolved that the Partnership for Academic Competition Excellence establish a Sportsmanship and Service Award. This commendation is to be presented to a high school academic competition team member, advisor, or organization whose character best promotes the spirit and honor of quiz bowl competition.

To establish a precedent and standard for future recipients of this award, the PACE committee has further resolved to establish, present, and dedicate this award to the memory of Benjamin E. Cooper of the "It's Academic" team of Georgetown Day School in Washington DC, as

the Benjamin Cooper Memorial Quiz Bowl Ambassador Award.

Established for presentation on June 19, 1998, at the Inaugural National Scholastics Championship.

Benjamin Cooper was a model student at Georgetown Day School (Washington DC), well-liked among his colleagues and faculty. He participated in many activities while in school and in service to the community. Because of his enthusiasm and encouragement to promote academic competition among his team members, he was selected as the varsity team captain for the 1997-1998 school year. On August 12, 1997, Ben was tragically killed in an automobile accident while returning from his summer job. His death was traumatic to his family, the Georgetown Day School community, and the members of the PACE Committee who corresponded and worked with him. Even when discussing quiz bowl and the PACE network with us, the PACE Committee was impressed with his enthusiasm about the upcoming year and our plans for the inaugural National Scholastics Championship.

In Ben's memory, PACE established the Academic Ambassador Award, to be presented to a high school advisor or organization whose character best promotes the spirit and honor of quiz bowl competition. In 2004, PACE established the Young Ambassador Award to recognize individuals from high school or college quiz bowl programs (including recent alumni) for valuable and significant contributions to the high school academic competition community. All nominations are presented to a jury of past Cooper Award recipients and the entire PACE membership, who then selects the finalists.

The 2007 Benjamin Cooper Academic Ambassador Award is awarded to Julie Gittings for her years of mentoring players of high school quiz bowl and being an ambassador to the game.

Mrs. Gittings took over coaching duties at State College in 1976 and has mentored over 1000 students over her thirty-year coaching career. Under her leadership, State College teams have either won or placed in the top five in national championships in a number of different formats: PACE, NAQT, Knowledge Master Open, Panasonic Academic Challenge, and National Academic Championship.

As a Learning Enrichment teacher, Gittings has been a strong advocate for students' needs, an approach evident in her promotion of high school quiz bowl. She has recruited and encouraged a significant number of female players to compete at the highest levels of a game often seen as male-dominated. She has also overseen the State College Academic Tournament, which was run for the fourth time in 2007, introducing more Pennsylvania teams to the pyramidal game. Outside of Pennsylvania, she has been a strong proponent of national tournament formats such as PACE and NAQT.

Through her efforts, Mrs. Gittings has served as a friendly and tireless ambassador to the circuit. Through three decades of mentoring student players and advocacy, she has strengthened the high school quiz bowl community in Pennsylvania and nationwide.

The 2007 Benjamin Cooper Young Crusader Award is awarded to Evan Silberman for his leadership in keeping the Thomas Jefferson team active in the absence of a formal coach or advisor, as well as for his support of the high school quiz bowl community in the Washington, DC area and nationally.

Evan joined Thomas Jefferson's "It's Academic" team in 2003 as a freshman. Even before picking up a buzzer to play in a tournament, he assisted Sam Lederer in the war room of TJ's Fall NAQT tournament, putting him on the path to hosting more tournaments. Over the course of his junior and senior years, he was at the helm of four TJ tournaments -- tournaments that have helped maintain the competitiveness of his region.

As co-captain his senior year, he led the Thomas Jefferson team in the absence of a coach or sponsor. These teams have remained competitive and maintained a strong level of sportsmanship throughout the year. Evan also has not hesitated to provide constructive suggestions to the high school quiz bowl community and notes that his favorite thing about quiz bowl is getting to know other players on the circuit.

In the fall, Evan will attend Hampshire College in Amherst, Massachusetts. While he will be writing for Academic Initiative, it is unknown if he will continue playing quiz bowl.
